LIFE TOGETHER

“Christianity means community through Jesus Christ and in Jesus Christ. No Christian community is more or less than this. Whether it be a brief, single encounter or the daily fellowship of years, Christian community is only this. We belong to one another only through and in Jesus Christ.

What does this mean? It means, first, that a Christian needs others because of Jesus Christ. It means, second, that a Christian comes to others only through Jesus Christ. It means, third, that in Jesus Christ we have been chosen from eternity, accepted in time, and united for eternity. First, the Christian is the man who no longer seeks his own salvation, his deliverance, his justification in himself, but in Jesus Christ alone. He knows that God's Word in Jesus Christ pronounces him guilty, even when he does not feel his guilt, and God's Word pronounces him righteous, even when he does not feel that he is righteous at all. The Christian no longer lives of himself by his own claims and of his own justification, but by God's claims and God's justification. He lives wholly by God's Word pronounced upon him whether that Word declares him guilty or innocent.

The death and the life of the Christian is not determined by his own resources; rather he finds both only in the Word that comes to him from the outside, in God's Word to him. The Christian lives wholly by the truth of God's Word in Jesus Christ. If somebody asks him, Where is your salvation, your righteousness? he can never point to himself. He points to the Word of God in Jesus Christ which assures him salvation and righteousness. A Christian comes to others only through Jesus Christ. Among people there is strife. "He is our peace," says Paul of Jesus Christ (Eph. 2:14). Without Christ there is discord between God and man and between man and man. Christ became the Mediator and made peace with God and among men. Without Christ we should not know God, we could not call upon him, nor come to him. But without Christ we also could not know our brother, nor could we come to him. The way is blocked by our own ego. Christ opened the way to God and to our brother. Now Christians can live with one another in peace; they can love and serve one another; they can become one. But they can continue to do so only by way of Jesus Christ are we one, only through him are we bound together. To eternity he remains the one Mediator.

When God was merciful to us, we learned to be merciful with our brethren. When we received forgiveness instead of judgment, we, too, were made ready to forgive our brethren. What God did to us, we then owed to others. The more we received, the more we were able to give; and the more meager our brotherly love, the less were we living by

God's mercy and love. Thus God himself taught us to meet one another as God has met us in Christ. "Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God (Romans 15:7)"

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, from Life Together

A "tradition" I have taken on over the years is annually reading Dietrich Bonhoeffer's Life Together. Bonhoeffer was a pastor who stood up for Christ and the truth of the Gospel in Nazi Germany. It cost him his life. He is worth reading not only because he was a martyr, but his words are both convicting and profound. I read and reread Life Together, because it cuts through all of the baggage that we have yoked the church with. Bonhoeffer continually points back to the truth of the gospel which pierces through traditions, political ideologies, and misconceptions that blow in the winds of culture. Why are we together? We are together because of what Christ has done in both the world and personally in our lives. We are flawed and broken but we have Christ. We may differ in race, language, politics, temperament, and a thousand other things but we have Jesus, and therein are united. We can be separated by thousands of miles or even death, but Jesus holds us together for eternity. There is nothing else that matters in the church. We tend to get distracted and splintered over many things that take our eyes off of Jesus. Jesus is why we worship on Sunday. Jesus is why we pray together. Jesus is why we have life, and hope, and peace. Jesus is our forgiveness! Jesus is our joy!

Many things can happen in a church. New members join. Beloved friends may leave. Currently we are in a transition as we begin to look to fill the void left by Ellen Gross's departure as accompanist. Whatever events may take place in the life of the church, Jesus remains constant. Jesus is our why. My prayer for you is that you might see Jesus anew in your life. I want you to taste and know Jesus in your fellowship in church. I want you to feel Jesus' love as you go about your day, that you might be reminded in all that we do, in all our Life Together, to live is Christ.

NEWS FROM THE PERSONNEL TEAM

The Personnel Team is sad to report that Ellen Gross, our organist/musician/accompanist for the past five years, submitted her resignation effective July 31, 2016. Session accepted her resignation with regret and many thanks for a job well done. As everyone who has attended worship in the past five years knows very well, Ellen is an exceptionally talented musician, and will be difficult to replace. The Worship and Music team, with assistance from Personnel as needed, has begun searching to find a new organist/accompanist.

The Personnel Team recently finished updating the job descriptions for each staff member at FHPC. The first step in the process was to review with each staff person the most recent job description on file for their position. The team also solicited input from the elder in charge of the ministry team most closely associated with each position. Once the new job descriptions were developed, they were approved by session and shared with the staff. The job description will be the basis for all performance reviews going forward.

As a matter of federal and state law, not to mention common courtesy and respect for the individual, personnel matters should always be treated confidentially. The Personnel Team seeks to follow that standard in all of our work, and we ask our congregation to understand and respect that standard as well.

If you have a question or concern for the Personnel Team, the Elder Chair of the team is Jim Shuster, and the congregation-at-large members are Patty Kemerer and Drew Wilson. Rev. Ben Black, as head of staff, is also a member of the team.

DISCIPLESHIP NEWS

"¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

In light of the Great Commission as a body of believers we should be constantly seeking to encourage and lift each other up in our trust and understanding of the gospel.
